**Dmitri M. Bondarenko** is an anthropologist, historian, and Africanist. He is Corresponding Member of the Russian Academy of Sciences. Dmitri is Vice-Director for Research with the Institute for African Studies and Full Professor with the Center of Social Anthropology of the Russian State University for the Humanities. His major research interests include social theory, anthropological and historical theory, political anthropology, culture and history of Africa, socio-cultural transformations and intercultural interaction in contemporary world (including ethnic, racial, and religious aspects) with special focus on Africa and people of African descent worldwide. Bondarenko has conducted fieldwork in the African states of Tanzania, Nigeria, Benin, Rwanda, and Zambia, as well as in Russia and the USA. Dmitri has authored over 450 publications, including seven monographs.
